WHY I SHOULD BE HEARD

Job justified himself and not God
Job's friends condemned Job but had no answer
Age should speak, years teach wisdom
BUT Shaddai inspires men
Great men not always wise nor judgment with aged
Therefore hearken to me, I will show my opinion



WHY I SHOULD BE HEARD

I listened to your arguments
None of you convicted Job or refuted his arguments
Job addressed not me, I will not use your arguments
I am full of words
I will show no favor
My maker would put an end to me if I did

Job, listen to all my words
I will speak my mind sincerely
Shaddai has given me the breath of life
Refute me if you can
I am fashioned from clay the same as you
Fear not, I will place no heavy pressure on you



THE CASE AGAINST JOB

You said:

I am clean without transgression

I am innocent not guilty

Yet God accuses me

He regards me as his enemy

he puts my feet in the stocks and watches me

Clean:

(Job 16:17 KJV) Not for [any] injustice in mine hands: also my prayer [is] pure.

without transgression:

(Job 7:21 KJV) And why dost thou not pardon my transgression, and take away mine iniquity? for now shall I sleep in the dust; and thou shalt seek me in the morning, but I [shall] not [be].

(Job 10:7 KJV) Thou knowest that I am not wicked; and [there is] none that can deliver out of thine hand.

without transgression (cont):

(Job 13:23 KJV) How many [are] mine iniquities and sins? make me to know my transgression and my sin.

(Job 14:17 KJV) My transgression [is] sealed up in a bag, and thou sewest up mine iniquity.

(Job 31:33 KJV) If I covered my transgressions as Adam, by hiding mine iniquity in my bosom:

(Job 31:34 KJV) Did I fear a great multitude, or did the contempt of families terrify me, that I kept silence, [and] went not out of the door?

neither iniquity:

(Job 10:6 KJV) That thou enquirest after mine iniquity, and searchest after my sin?

(Job 10:14 KJV) If I sin, then thou markest me, and thou wilt not acquit me from mine iniquity.

(Job 31:11 KJV) For this [is] an heinous crime; yea, it [is] an iniquity [to be punished by] the judges.

(Job 31:28 KJV) This also [were] an iniquity [to be punished by] the judge: for I should have denied the God [that is] above.

You said:

He [God] findeth occasions against me He [God] counteth me for his enemy

occasions:

Nothing

count:

(Job 6:26 KJV) Do ye imagine to reprove words, and the speeches of one that is desperate, [which are] as wind?

enemy:

(Job 13:24 KJV) Wherefore hidest thou thy face, and holdest me for thine enemy?

(Job 19:11 KJV) He hath also kindled his wrath against me, and he counteth me unto him as [one of] his enemies.

(Job 27:7 KJV) Let mine enemy be as the wicked, and he that riseth up against me as the unrighteous.

THE CASE AGAINST JOB

You said:
He [God] putteth my feet in the stocks
He [God] marketh all my paths

feet in stocks, marketh my paths:

(Job 13:27 KJV) Thou puttest my feet also in the stocks, and lookest narrowly unto all my paths; thou settest a print upon the heels of my feet.

(Job 7:20 KJV) I have sinned; what shall I do unto thee, 0 thou preserver of men? why hast thou set me as a mark against thee, so that I am a burden to myself?

(Job 14:16 KJV) For now thou numberest my steps: dost thou not watch over my sin?

THE CASE AGAINST JOB (CONT)



Job, pay attention - listen to me
Keep quiet and I will speak
If you have something to say, answer me
Speak, I want to show you are right
If not, listen to me
Keep quiet and I will teach you wisdom

Hear my words, you sages
Listen to me you who know so much
The ear tests words as the palate tastes food
Let us choose for ourselves what is just
Let us decide for ourselves what is good

Elihu THE CASE AGAINST JOB (CONT)



You said:
I am righteous
God has taken away my judgment

I am righteous:

(Job 27:6 KJV) My righteousness I hold fast, and will not let it go: my heart shall not reproach [me] so long as I live.

taken away my judgment:

(Job 19:7 KJV) Behold, I cry out of wrong, but I am not heard: I cry aloud, but [there is] no judgment.

(Job 27:2 KJV) [As] God liveth, [who] hath taken away my judgment; and the Almighty, [who] hath vexed my soul;

Elihu THE CASE AGAINST JOB (CONT)

You said:
Should I lie against my right?
My wound is incurable without transgression

lie against my right:

(Job 27:5 KJV) God forbid that I should justify you: till I die I will not remove mine integrity from me.

my wound is incurable:

(Job 6:4 KJV) For the arrows of the Almighty [are] within me, the poison whereof drinketh up my spirit: the terrors of God do set themselves in array against me.

(Job 30:15 KJV) Terrors are turned upon me: they pursue my soul as the wind: and my welfare passeth away as a cloud.

without transgression

nothing



ELIHU'S CHARGE

Job drinks in scoffing like water

Job keeps company with evil doers and wicked men

Job says there is no profit to delight oneself with God



JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

God doesn't do anything wicked Men receive payment for what they do Each receives in accordance with his conduct Shaddai does not pervert justice Did someone put God in charge of the earth? If God gathered all spirit and breath, all flesh would perish



JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

Should a hater of justice be in control?
Would you call a king a scoundrel, nobles wicked?
Then don't condemn the Just and Mighty One
God is not a respecter of persons
He keeps watch on all
Wrong doers cannot hide

Syllogism

Premise: What God does is just

Observation: Job questions what God has done to him

Conclusion: Job hates justice



JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

God doesn't warn people when they must be judged
The mighty are shattered, not needing to investigate
They are overturned, they know what they're doing
They are treated like criminals for all to see
The cries of the poor and oppressed come before him

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JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

Has anyone said to God:

"I have been chastised without having offended"

"Teach me what I have failed to see"

"If I have done wrong, I will do it no more"

Must God's rewards meet your approval?



ELIHU'S CHARGE

Job speaks without knowledge or wisdom Job answers like wicked men To his sin Job adds rebellion

Elihu THE CASE AGAINST JOB (CONT)



You said:

My righteousness is more than God's What profit or advantage to be cleansed from my sin?

my righteousness is more than God's:

None

what advantage:

(Job 21:15 KJV) What [is] the Almighty, that we should serve him? and what profit should we have, if we pray unto him?



JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

If you sin, how do you hurt God?
If your crimes are many, how do you affect God?
If you are righteous, what do you give him
What does God receive from you?
Your evil or righteousness can only affect humans

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ELIHU'S CHARGE

Oppressions cause people to cry out
Pride causes no one to ask "Where is God my maker"
People cry but no one answers because of evil pride
Your evil or righteousness can only affect humans
Shaddai pays no attention to empty cries



JOB'S EXPECTED OUTCOME

You say you shall not see Him
But judgment is before Him - trust Him
Because you don't trust him, he has visited in anger
You don't know it because of your arrogance
